Season of Lent

In 1966 Pope Paul VI reorganized the Church's practice of public penance in his "Apostolic Constitution on Penance" (*Poenitemini*). The 1983 revision of the Code of Canon Law incorporated the changes made by Pope Paul. Not long after that, the U.S. bishops applied the canonical requirements to the practice of public penance in our country.

To sum up those requirements, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal.

Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine and lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning.

**El primer viernes de Cuaresma es este viernes, 24 de febrero.**

**Temporada de Cuaresma**

En 1966, el Papa Pablo VI reorganizó la práctica de la Iglesia de la penitencia pública en su "Constitución Apostólica de Penitencia" (Poenitemini). La revisión del código de derecho canónico de 1983 incorpora los cambios realizados por el Papa Pablo. No mucho después de eso, los obispos de U.S. aplican los requisitos canónicos para la práctica de la penitencia pública en nuestro país.

Resumendo dichos requisitos, los católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 están obligados a ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Además, todos los católicos mayores de 14 años deben abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, Viernes Santo y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.

**El ayuno**, como se ha explicado por los obispos de EEUU, significa comer sólo una comida completa. Algunos alimentos (que no igualen otra comida completa) están permitidos en el desayuno y alrededor del mediodía o en la noche, dependiendo de cuando una persona elija comer la comida principal o completa.

**Abstinencia** prohíbe el uso de carne, pero no de huevos, productos lácteos o condimentos hechos de grasa animal.

La abstinencia no incluye jugo de carne y alimentos líquidos hechos de carne. Entonces, alimentos como caldo de pollo, consomme, sopas cocidas o sazonadas con carne, salsas de carne, al igual que sazón o condimentos hechos de grasas animales no están prohibidos. Por lo tanto, es admisible utilizar margarina y manteca de cerdo. Goteos de tocino que contienen pequeños trozos de carne pueden ser vertidos sobre lechuga como condimento.
